2019 was the year of awesome achievements for Mission Rabies! In one incredible year we vaccinated our millionth dog while our education teams reached their three millionth child. Both of these momentous numbers are massive milestones in our mission to stop all human deaths from rabies.

Crucially, all of the evidence is showing that hitting these targets for vaccinations and education is having the desired impact. The number of human deaths from this horrific disease is falling throughout our project sites. This is what it's all about.

Our on-going task is to keep this momentum going and affect even more life-saving change in rabies hotspots around the world. To this end, 2019 saw dedicated Mission Rabies teams vaccinate an average of 598 dogs every single day of the year.

On top of our scientific work being published in numerous publications including *MDPI* and *Science Direct*, our projects expanded into new countries to ensure that even more communities can be protected from rabies.

To all those who were part of this epic year, thank you! Nothing in this report could have been achieved without you and it's a privilege to have you join us on this journey. I'm massively excited about what we can achieve together throughout 2020.

VACCINATE

We run mass canine vaccination campaigns in global rabies hotspots, by vaccinating 70% of a canine population we can achieve herd immunity and stop the spread of rabies in its tracks.

EDUCATE

With lack of awareness being a key reason why people die from rabies, we run life-saving education programmes equipping communities with the knowledge they need to stay safe.

ELIMINATE

Through repeated annual mass vaccination, we can eliminate rabies from an area. We are committed to working towards the shared global goal of eliminating canine-transmitted rabies by 2030!

CALLS TO OUR RABIES HOTLINE

With a third of all estimated human rabies cases occurring in India - the country is the world's hotspot for the disease. In 2019 our teams in Goa continued to work exceptionally hard to vaccinate as many dogs as possible - from the coastal beaches, to the rural interior, through all weathers, searching every corner to make Goa the country's first rabies-free state!

THE MISSION RABIES TRUCK

Mission Rabies, in partnership with our sister charity Worldwide Veterinary Service, operates a truly unique, all-terrain, mobile veterinary hospital in India. The MR Truck hosts outreach campaigns, training courses and mobile clinics around India - championing canine welfare through providing free veterinary resources in areas no other veterinary services can reach.

The Truck also acts as an incredible engagement tool, raising awareness and encouraging communities to talk about rabies, humane population control and canine welfare. This year it made a special appearance at the Goa carnival, where our teams demonstrated their dog catching skills and delivered our messages to the 70,000 people in attendance!

We began our project in Blantyre in 2015, after the city's Queen Elizabeth Hospital recorded the highest number of child rabies deaths from any institution across Africa. Over the past four years, our teams have been working tirelessly to make this the lowest. Throughout 2019, we have been able to continue to improve efficiency at our projects in Blantyre, Zomba and Chiradzulu and for the first time extended our reach into Thyolo district.

In 2019, we identified the need to protect the communities surrounding Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park from the threat of rabies, alongside the park's endangered mountain gorilla population. The region presented our teams with a unique challenge with multiple remote areas, we therefore adapted our methods, utilising radio to spread awareness amongst the most isolated communities.

Following three years of successful work with our partner charity Mbwa wa Africa in the Meru District of North East Tanzania, 2019 saw the development of a new vaccination strategy to tackle rabies in a rural setting. By setting up roaming static vaccination points, we massively increased efficiency and were able to expand to four additional wards. Alongside the 10 day vaccination drive, Mission Rabies' sister charity Worldwide Veterinary Service ran a sterilisation clinic, providing humane population control by neutering 295 dogs.


EDUCATION

Whilst our vaccination drives work to reduce rabies within a community, our education programme equips children with the knowledge they need to stay safe and therefore helps to reduce human deaths immediately.

772,779 18,368 CHILDREN TEACHERS EDUCATED REACHED

In our interactive lessons, children learn about the dangers of rabies, how to stay safe around dogs and crucially what to do if bitten. We also run sessions across the wider community to ensure our messages are spread as far as possible.

2019 saw major progress for our education teams in India and Malawi, as rabies prevention became part of the school curriculum - rabies education will soon be delivered to over four million primary school children in Malawi and around seven million children ever year in India!





VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are vital to our work, bringing fresh energy and enthusiasm and enabling us to work on a scale that would not otherwise be possible. We are always looking for passionate individuals to join our teams - whether or not you are from a veterinary background, there are meaningful ways to get involved!

RESEARCH

Research continues to underpin everything we do at Mission Rabies. Our proof-of-concept projects are the test-beds to push the frontiers of operational research - developing effective and efficient approaches to mass dog vaccination, which can ultimately be implemented by governments on a large scale.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Our continued collaboration with the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) saw us support an emergency response to an outbreak of rabies on the border between Haiti and the Dominican Republic in January 2019. Use of the WVS App enabled rapid, centralised collection of data to understand the scale of the outbreak, rapid identification of people who had been exposed and the planning of a comprehensive vaccination response.

TESTING FOR THE FUTURE

In 2019, Mission Rabies published six scientific publications in peer-review journals focusing on the practicalities of running effective mass dog vaccination campaigns and identifying optimal approaches to achieving the critical 70% vaccination coverage needed. Our teams also coauthored on a further four with partners.

This pioneering research directly supports the planning of larger regional and national dog vaccination campaigns and maximises a government's chances of success when investing public funds in rabies control efforts.





FINANCES

During 2019, Mission Rabies spent £1,295,202 delivering life-saving projects in rabies hotspots around the world. This demonstrates an increase of 6.6% compared to 2018, clearly showing our determination to eliminate human deaths from rabies.

Matching this, our income for the year increased by 6% from 2018 to £1,335,269. Thank you to all who donated and fundraised to allow so much work to be completed.
